While I don't have the full breakdown of the U.S.- Philippine forces in 1941-1942, I have worked out a useable organization for the 26th Cavalry (PS). The Cavalry Company (U.S. nomenclature never officially adopted the term "Troop", although most writers used the terms interchangeably), consisted of an 8 man HQs, with three rifle platoons and one LMG platoon each with three squads. The Philippine Scouts (PS) were all armed with the M1 as their issue weapon. The LMG was the M1919A2, a more slightly more compact version of the more common M1919A4.

Each platoon was organized (in CoC terms) as follows:

Platoon Leader, SL, armed with a pistol

Platoon Sergeant, SL, armed with a rifle (M1), as well as 3 rifle men (messengers?) along with:

3 Rifle Squads, each with a CPL squad leader, JL, and 8 rifle men (M1)

The average service of time for members was 13 years and they were known for their professional ism and discipline. The addition of a Red die to their command dice would be appropriate.

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
